Technium Challenge triumph for SpeechSchool

Since its launch in February the online-based voice coaching service has received great responses from subscribers who credit the service with helping them to improve confidence, enhance employment prospects and convince others of their ideas much more easily.

SpeechSchool.TV is a leading provider of dynamic speech training. It offers a subscription based Internet TV Channel that is the result of over 30 years' learning and practice in the area of English speech training and accent/voice coaching.

SpeechSchool.TV is the second consecutive ecentre company to come away as the New Zealand winner of the challenge, following in the footsteps of last year's New Zealand winner WhoStoleMyMoney.

New Zealand companies have traditionally done very well in the Technium Challenge, with local company Xero being named the overall winner in 2006/2007 and another local company TracPlus Global being named overall winner in 2007/2008.

"I think entrepreneurship comes naturally to New Zealanders," Simon Angelo added. "They live in an environment with a great deal of freedom to think, create and dream – although once this is done, larger markets beyond the farm gate generally need to be sought."
